Lionfish are a voracious predator that has been introduced into the Atlantic, Caribbean, and Gulf of Mexico. They have very serious effects on native species here and can alter the way our delicate ecosystems function. In this forum we will discuss the lionfish's biology, its effects on native species and ecosystems, we will explore how they got here in the first place, and what we can do about them now that they are here.
