What do you see when you look at the South Texas rangeland brush? Has the brush always been there? Or did climate and changes in land management alter the density of these species? Our local brush species support a diverse array of wildlife, shade and some forage for livestock, and play a part in the rich history of South Texas. On the other hand, well-meaning plant introductions and poor management has created some monocultures and unproductive land. Come learn to identify the most common brush species in the Corpus Christi area, their historical and current uses, and innovative ways researchers and managers are working to maintain productive rangelands.
